Another book of interest is BLUE RIDGE MOUNTAIN MEMORIES. It is just great - I've read it three times! It's a true story about Jackson County (early 1900's) written by Alice McGuire Bird Hamilton who grew up in Norton and whose first husband was Terrell Bird of Whittier. She has changed names slightly but if you knew the people you can tell who they were. Examples: Norman (Norton), Greg McCloud (George McGuire), Zimmer (Zachary), Walton (Wilson),

Leander Edmons (Land Edwards), Bowen (Bolick), Hilton (Higdon), Ted Bryant (Ed Bryson) I want your help on this. Please send me names you know. I am trying to learn who all the people are in the book. If you can help, please let me know. For those of you who wish to get a copy, I have ordered several copies direct from the publisher in Atlanta. (The first one I bought in a bookstore cost me \$6.00.) I got these for \$4.50 each plus postage and handling charges. If you want a copy, send me \$4.50 plus \$.63 \$ for postage. These books are hard to find in bookstores so I thought if I got a few, there would be family members who would like to read them.

WALTON CO., GA. 1862 CENSUS, WESTERN DISTRICT, UNDER CAPT. FANE listed Jothan Comard, as head of the household of 6 whites, 0 blacks, His near neighbors included Peter Weaver, Jas. Chasteen, Peter Chasteen, Ab Chasteen, In Feb 1807 Walton Co., Ga. citizens petitioned the Governor urging an exact boundary line be established. Signers included Johna Coward, Peter Weaver, James Chasteen, Sen., James Chasteen, Jr., etc. I also learned from the same issue that Buncombe County land grants were issued in 1803 to David Rogers, in 1805 to Matthew Rogers, and in 1806 to William Rogers together with Tho. Love. In the REVOLUTIONARY WAR INDEX I found several Cowards:
